Our primary sewing machine for this series is the Bernina Artista 165E. In addition, we used the Bernina Artista 200E with embroidery module for episodes #101 and #106. We used a Bernina serger for episodes #101 and #110. We also use the Klutz cut-resistant safety glove each time we cut with a rotary cutter. We use basic sewing supplies such as fabric, rotary cutter, scissors, and rulers, plus the specific items listed below. Supplies Show-by-Show

101. Holiday Napkins: Bernina #1200DA serger, wooly nylon thread, Bernina Artista 200E sewing machine with embroidery module, OESD heavy-duty cut-away stabilizer, heavy-duty adhesive water soluble stabilizer, Isacord 40 wt. polyester thread, Bernina Embroidery Cards including *Christmas*, *Leslie Beck Holiday*, *Classic Fashion* by Martha Pullen, and *Every Day with Mary Engelbreit*.

102. Just Ducky: Novelty fabric, fusible web, tear-away stabilizer, Sulky rayon thread, Bernina #20 open-toe presser foot.

103. Super Special Binding: Polyester rug yarn, Bernina zipper foot, glue stick, monofilament thread.

104. Fun with Fusibles: Heavyweight, no-sew fusible web, reducing lens, window template, tweezers, press cloth.

105. Cathedral Window: No special supplies.

106. Labels for Your Quilts: Bernina Artista 200E sewing machine with embroidery module, fabric marking pens, OESD heavyweight stabilizer.

107. Invisible Machine Appliqué: Mylar template material, glue stick, Solvy or Aquasolv water-soluble stabilizer.

108. Courthouse Steps Log Cabin: Pre-printed panel fabrics.

109. Appliqué Vines: No special supplies.

110. Pillowcases: Bernina #1200DA serger, mini clothespins, computer printer fabric sheets (June Tailor), Gelly Roll pens.

111. Paper Piecing: Sulky water-soluble foundation paper.

112. Machine Quilting: American Professional Quilting Systems Millennium professional long-arm quilting machine, "convertible" table, Quilters' Resource and Sulky decorative threads, Ultra Solvy and Solvy water-soluble stabilizers, spray adhesive, textured yarns, silk "tops."

113. Machine Appliqué: *Secrets to Successful Appliqué* by Joyce Drexler, Sulky stabilizers, KK 2000 spray adhesive, Sulky iron-on transfer pen, permanent marking pen, Sulky decorative threads.
