

Sewing machines for the series are the Bernina Aurora 440 Quilters Edition, Bernina Artista 640, and Bernina Artista 200 with Embroidery Module. For patchwork, we use the #37 patchwork presser foot or the new #57 foot. We use basic sewing supplies such as fabric, rotary cutters, scissors, and rulers, plus specific items listed below. We wear a Klutz cut-resistant safety glove when we rotary cut, we press with a Maytag Cordless Iron, and we measure with Omnigrid, Omnigrip, and Fons & Porter rulers. We use many fabrics from Moda. Patterns and instructions for quilts featured are in Love of Quilting magazine. We now have DVDs available for our TV shows beginning with the 400 series.

701. Brave New World: Fons & Porter Triangle Trimmers. (Instructions for *Brave New World* are in the May/June 2006 issue of *Love of Quilting*.)

702. English Paper-Pieced Ornaments: Heavy card stock paper, small binder clips, hand sewing needles, thimble, Sulky KK2000 Temporary Spray Adhesive, wired ribbon. (Instructions for *English Paper-pieced Ornaments* are in the Nov/Dec 2005 issue of *Love of Quilting*.)

703. Embroidering Large Quilt Blocks: Hoop-it-All Double Wide hoop kit, silver quilters pencil, King Tut thread by Superior, Variations thread by YLI, OESD Aqua Mesh Wash-Away and Stabil-Stick Cut-Away embroidery stabilizers, OESD HR Five Spray Adhesive, *Tassels and Trims* book by Louisa Meyer, "Boo to You" embroidery collection by Sheryl Strole, "Quilting Inspirations" embroidery collection by Karen Emmerson, and "Santa Fe Wallflowers" embroidery collection by Julie Hogan.

704. Wedding Wishes: From Marti Michell 60° (3"-9") triangle ruler, Omnigrid Glowline Tape. (Instructions for *Wedding Wishes* are in the Jan/Feb 2006 issue of *Love of Quilting*.)

705. Let's Quilt with Ann Kistro: Omnigrid 4½" square ruler, Fons & Porter Triangle Trimmers. Ann's quilts are in *Let's Quilt* by Ann Kistro published by Martingale.

706. Pine Burr: Fons & Porter Triangle Trimmers, Omnigrid 4½" square (#45G), and 6" x 1" ruler. (Instructions for *Pine Burr* quilt are in the Jan/Feb 2006 issue of *Love of Quilting*.)

707. Vintage Handkerchief Quilts: OESD Aqua Mesh Wash-Away embroidery stabilizer and HR Five Spray and Stick adhesive, cloth cocktail napkin from All About Blanks, "Grandmothers Linens" collection from embroideryonline.com, "Madame Juliette" collection from loraliedesigns.com, Bernina Artista embroidery software, "Hanky Panky" crazy quilt designs by Cindy Brick, handkerchief edging from www.k-lace.com.

708. Thread Embellishments: Sulky threads including Blendables, Holoshimmer, and rayon, Sulky Fuse 'n Stitch Cut Away Permanent Stabilizer, QRI Double Bend Scissors.

709. Longarm Quilting: American Professional Quilting Systems Millennium longarm quilting machine, Superior threads including Razzle Dazzle, rayon variegated, and Mono-poly.

710. Basic Rotary Cutting: Omnigrid and Fons & Porter rulers.

711. Flying Geese: Fons & Porter Flying Geese Ruler, 1" x 12" Omnigrid ruler, Fons & Porter portable pressing mat.

712. Point Trimming: Fons & Porter portable pressing mat, Fons & Porter Triangle Trimmers, Omnigrid 4½" square. (Instructions for *Jewel of the Prairie* are in July/August 2005 issue of *Love of Quilting*.)

713. Half-Yard Challenge: Fons & Porter quarter-square triangle ruler, Omnigrid 96 & 98 triangle rulers, EZ Angle and EZ Companion Angle, Fons & Porter portable pressing mat, Fons & Porter Triangle Trimmers. (Instructions for *Half-Yard Challenge* are in Jan/Feb 2006 issue of *Love of Quilting*.)
